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SYNOPSIS

Challenge

Being aggrieved by the notification dated 15.12.2022 with very short notice for the upcoming JEE Mains Exam scheduled in the month of January, 2023, the present petition is filed seeking deferment of the said examination to a convenient date in a month of April, 2023 and for relaxation of the eligibility criteria of 75% score in the XIIth standard examination to pass marks for entrance examination or Application.

Point to be Urged

The notification dated 15.12.2022 issued with very short notice for the upcoming JEE Mains Exam scheduled in the month of January, 2023, which are clashing with the Pre-Board and Practical Examination in the month of January, 2023 scheduled by various state boards, therefore students will find it very difficult to appear in the JEE main examination scheduled on 24th to 31st January, 2023 which will effect their academic career.

Many Students from academic year 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 are going to apply for the present JEE exams are from the Batches of 2020-21 and 2021-22 who had been assessed in their board examination on the basis of their

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
performance in the previous examinations as their board examinations were cancelled. The Marks scored by them is not a true reflection of their actual ability therefore those students with less marks than the eligibility criteria (75%) for this year's examinations can score very high marks in the upcoming JEE Mains, 2023 and if a fair chances denied to them that will affect the future lakhs of bright.

1. The present Petitioner herein is a child rights activist and working for welfare and redressal of grievance of various students, including the Board Students studying at various grade of various schools functioning in the State of Maharashtra and other states of the Union of India. The Petitioner's Annual Income is about Rs. 4.90 lacs she is paying income tax, having her PAN Card, which has been specified in the title of the present Petition. That the Petitioner is filing the instant Public Interest Litigation for the general benefit of Public. The Petitioner has no personal interest in the litigation and the Petition is not guided by self-gain or forgain of any other person/institution/body and that there is no oblique motive other than of public interest in filing the present Public Interest Obligation Petition.
2. The Petitioner is raising issues concerning the welfare of students, academic issues, issues regarding school fees and the implementation of various laws

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regarding the welfare of children before various forums. Many students studying in CBSE, ICSE, NIOS and State Board approached the Petitioner for issues they are facing regarding the Board Examination and the upcoming JEE MAINS in January 2023 and is thus interested and directly affected by the out come of the above mentioned Public Interest Litigation. That, the mental pressure that is created for performance in this exam is so much that, every year number of students commit suicide for fear of under performance or of failure. In the last year to make the students appear and face examination with the additional fear of getting infected by the Covid-19 virus and therefore many students couldn't appear or attempt and in such a situation if they are not given a fair chance it will not only be unfair but the same will be absolutely inhuman. Hence the Petitioner is filing the present Writ Petition under Article 226 as their claim is genuine and to protect their fundamental rights of

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education under Article 14 and 21 of the Constitution of India.

II. PARTICULARS OF RESPONDENTS

3. The Petitioner submits that, the Respondent No.1 is the National Testing Agency through its Chairperson, which is an autonomous testing organization established to conduct entrance examination for admission/fellowship in higher educational institutions. The Respondent No.2 is Union of India through The Ministry of Education through its Secretary, The Ministry of Education (abbr. MoE; formerly the Ministry of Human Resource Development from 1985 to 2020) is a ministry of the Government of India, **responsible for the implementation of the National Policy on Education.** The Respondent No.3 National Commission For Protection of Child Rights, is an Indian statutory body established by an Act of Parliament, the Commission for Protection of Child

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Rights Act, 2005. The Commission works under the
aegis of Ministry of Women and Child Development,
GoI.

III DECLARATION AND UNDERTAKING OF THE
PETITIONER:

4. That the present Petition is being filed by way of
Public Interest Litigation and Petitioner does not
have any personal interest in the matter. The
Petitioner states that, the instant Public Interest
Litigation is being filed in Public Interest and if the
reliefs as prayed therein by the Petitioner are not
granted then irreparable loss and harm will be
caused, not only to the Petitioner but to the Public at
large as the purpose of filing the present Petition is
for the benefits of the public at large.
5. That the entire cost of the present Petition including
Advocates Fees and other charges are being borne by
the Petitioner.

V. FACTS IN BRIEF:


6. The Petitioner is preferring this Public Interest Litigation Petition on behalf of the students aggrieved by the Notification dated 15.12.2022 for the upcoming JEE Mains Exam scheduled in the month of January, 2023 preferring this Writ Petition for the urgent reliefs (1) deferring the said examination to a convenient date in the month of April, 2022 after the board exams and further (2) for the relaxation of the eligibility criteria of 75% score in the XIIth standard examination to minimum pass marks to be eligible for entrance examination or Application.
7. The Petitioner states that, the Notification Dated 15/12/2022 intimating the time schedule of JEE MAINS to be held in 2023 has been issued at a short notice that too clashing with the Board Practical Examinations, Pre-board Examination and other internal Assessment, Viva of CBSE, ISC (CISCE) and various state boards, which will decide the eligibility of the students.

8. The Petitioner states that, most of the State Boards have scheduled their Pre-Board and Practical Examination in the month of January, 2023 therefore such students will find it very difficult to appear in these main examination due from 24th to 31st January, 2023 which will effect their academic career Therefore, the JEE Examination which is planned to be conducted in the month of January, 2023 will be non beneficial to them because they won't be able to appear for the exam.
9. The Petitioner further states that, contrary to the last 2 academic years 2021-22 and 2022-23 the eligibility criteria of 75% in HSC Board Examination will hit lakhs of students who can score very high in the JEE Examination but may not have 75% minimum marks in their goals in their board examination. However until last year the eligibility criteria of 75% of HSC Examination were not applicable for academic years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023. Now they will be affected by the sudden change of the eligibility criteria during

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the fag end of their academic year. Therefore, the eligibility criteria should not be changed at least for this time to save the future of lakhs of students in India.

10. The Petitioner states that, the students are into 7 to 8 months for their final year course for the board examination with the expectation to appear in the JEE Mains with the minimum pass marks in their HSC Board Examination. Hereto annexed and marked **Exhibit – "A"** is the copy of the Circular for the JEE Mains 2023.
11. The Petitioner states that, the announcement of the JEE Main 2023 is at a very short notice. Normally, the exams are declared 3-4 months prior to the schedule. The Petitioner states that the Schedule for the JEE Main examination in the year 2020 was finalised around four months prior to the Examination i.e. in the month of August, 2019 giving four months time to prepare for the same and that




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too without clashing with their board examination as the Board exams were not scheduled at that time of fixing JEE Main Examination of that year.

12. However in the instant case due to the short Notice the students appearing for State Board Exams like, Maharashtra, Assam and Bihar Board, where final year examinations for XIIth standard will start from February, 2023, whose Practicals, Vivos and other Academic matters will be on in the month of January, 2023. Therefore, they are leaving no room for proper preparation or the students, who is appearing for JEE Examination till 31st January, 2023.
13. The Petitioner further states that, the JOSSA and CSAB rounds were finished at the end of October, 2022 and the droppers of the said exams will get only 1.5 months for the preparation of JEE Exam considering as per the assumption that the JEE Advanced 2023 (Session-2) will be mostly conducted in the month of May, 2023. However, if the JEE

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
Mains 2023 is re-scheduled to April 2023 the JEE Advanced Examination can be conducted in the month of June, 2023 which will make only one month difference than the normal schedule.

14. The Petitioner further states that, the students got the wind of the matter about the examination in the month of November, 2022 as per the report / published in times of India, However, the DG of National Testing Agency denied all such claims by the media. Then it was stated that all such claims are untrue. However, to the utter shock of the aspirants now the Notification has come declaring the dates in the month of January, 2023 thereby affecting the preparation of lakhs of students of the said examination.
15. The Petitioner further states that, JEE Mains of last two years were severely affected by the Covid Pandemic and due to which many deserving students could not appear in the online examinations conducted then and thus resulting in the injustice to



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the lakhs of online students who did not have proper connectivity. On this ground also the students should be given proper time for preparation at least in this year.

16. The Petitioner states that, CBSE has announced their theory exam for standard XII with effect from 15.02.2023 therefore in the months of January and February, 2023 the students will be busy preparing for their final off-line examination, Pre-Board, Practicals, Viva and other internal assessment and assignment from 1st January onwards. Hereto annexed and marked **Exhibit – "B"** is the copy of the Circular for practical of CBSE Board.
17. The Petitioner states that with this year onwards the exams could be normalised without Covid threats but the students should be given a fair chance to prepare their examination. And further many students were entitle for NIT's IIT's IIIT's irrespective of per-centage of board examination but many eligible students did not offer many centre due



to corona pandemic and distant location from their home town hoping that many eligible student who do not opted for their allotted colleges on account of farplaces from their home town.

18. The Petitioner further state that, Assam State Board Practical Exams are going to be held from January 25th to 15thFebruary , 2023 which is going to be clashed with the JEE Mains.The Bihar Board Exam is starting from 1st February 2023 so it will be very difficult for the Bihar board students to commute from the JEE Mains centre to their Board centres as the JEE Mains centres are located at a very far place. These students will loose a very important opportunity to appear for an important exam of their lifetime and career.Hereto annexed and marked **Exhibit – "C, C-1"**are the copies of the Examination Schedule of Assam Board and BiharBoard.
19. The Petitioner states that they have already written to the Ministry of Education, NCPCR , PMO, NTA, Government of India for the deferment of the

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examination. Hereto annexed and marked Exhibit
- "D, D-1, D-2, D-3" are the copies of the said
letters sent through e-mail to the Education Minister,
NCPCR, PMO, NTA, Government of India.

20. The Petitioner states that, the JEE Main Exams for 2022 was announced in the month of March, 2022 but after numerous complaints and representations by the students and other bodies the Respondent No.1 had re-scheduled the said Exams to last week of June, 2022 just 15 days prior to the commencement of the JEE Mains Exam. Therefore, the Respondent No.1 can re-schedule the dates of JEE Mains Exams as well as of JEE Advance to convenient dates for the benefits of the lakhs of students. The Petitioner further states that, the eligibility criteria which was relaxed for the year 2021-22 on account of the corona pandemic and even now many of the students are going to apply for the present exams are from the said Batches of 2020-21 and 2021-22 who had been assessed in their board examination on the basis of


their performance in the previous years as their examinations were cancelled. Therefore, the Marks scored by them is not a true reflection of their actual ability therefore those students with less marks than the eligibility criteria (75%) for this year's examinations could perform well in the JEE Mains and if a fair chance is denied to them that will affect the future of lakhs of bright students. The Petitioner states that Hereto annexed and marked Exhibit – "E & E-1" are the copies of the Mark sheets of two students.

21. The Petitioner states that many of the students who did not score well in the last year exam had been preparing for their next chance in the upcoming exams only able to apply for the present exam on account of these difficulties.
22. The Petitioner states that many students of different boards in the Academic Year 2021-22 could not appear their practical, viva etc. due to Covid and hence they scored less in their practical or viva



their performance in the previous years as their examinations were cancelled. Therefore, the Marks scored by them is not a true reflection of their actual ability therefore those students with less marks than the eligibility criteria (75%) for this year's examinations could perform well in the JEE Mains and if a fair chance is denied to them that will affect the future of lakhs of bright students. The Petitioner states that Hereto annexed and marked Exhibit – "E & E-1" are the copies of the Mark sheets of two students.


21. The Petitioner states that many of the students who did not score well in the last year exam had been preparing for their next chance in the upcoming exams only able to apply for the present exam on account of these difficulties.
22. The Petitioner states that many students of different boards in the Academic Year 2021-22 could not appear their practical, viva etc. due to Covid and hence they scored less in their practical or viva



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therefore though their marks appearing in the board exam is less but they are very bright students who could score in the examination. They should be given fairchance in their upcoming exam by re-schedule the same.

23. The Petitioner states that, many other competitive exams are also scheduled in the month of January 2023 that too clashing with JEE Mains. One of such being NDA SSB interview for the year 2023 is already scheduled on 23rd to 27th January, 2023, wherein the age limit is 19 years. So the students appearing for this exam will miss the chance for NDA due to age limit. Therefore, the instant examination being a very important examination in the academic career of the students the same should be deferred to a convenient date without affecting the future of the students. Hereto annexed and marked Exhibit – "F" is the copy of the NDA selection Notification.
24. The Petitioner states that, they have made necessary representations to respective authorities however no



fruitful replies have been received , therefore, the Petitioners are left with no efficacious remedy than approaching this Hon'ble Court by way of this Petition.

GROUND

i) The Respondent no.1 has given such a short Notice of just over a month (precisely 40 days) for the upcoming JEE mains for 2023 than the normal 3-4 months advance notice before the Next Exam.

ii) The declared dates of the JEE mains 2023, from 24th -31st January,2023 are mainly clashing with the dates of 12th Standard state Boards, CBSE, ICSE and other competitive exams/ interviews of NDA SSB



etc. and thus depriving many eligible students from appearing in the Exams.

iii) The Respondent no.1 has declared the eligibility criteria for application as 75% in HSC for the general candidates and 65% for the reserved categories unlike the last year's criteria of pass marks. This condition is altogether removing the droppers of the last year's Exam out of the race, as they scored less in the board but scored over 99% in JEE.

iv) The Respondent no.1 has failed to appreciate the fact that the final year students are at the fag end of their academic year. They were preparing with the expectation that the eligibility criteria will be same as that of the last year.



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v) The Respondent no.1 failed to appreciate the fact that many students appearing for the upcoming exam are the students from the batches of the pandemic period. Those students were evaluated on different scales/parameters, which necessarily doesn't reflect the actual capabilities of the candidates.

25. The Petitioner submits that, the Respondents could not provide any relief to the aspirants in spite of several representations made by the aggrieved students, therefore, this Petition is filed invoking jurisdiction of this Hon'ble High Court under the Article 226 of the Constitution of India.
26. The Petitioner has not received any notice from the Respondents about the above subject matter of this Petition by way of Caveat.

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27. The Petitioner submits that, all the formalities like submitting the necessary declarations and Affidavits along with undertakings have been submitted with this Petition.
28. The Petitioner submits that, the Petitioner has no immediate and other equally efficacious remedy available other than this Writ Petition and has therefore approached the Hon'ble Court at the earliest for redressal and grievances. Further Petitioner states that, if the reliefs as prayed by her are not granted then irreparable harm and injury will be caused to the students, whereas no harm and injury will be caused to the Respondents if the same are granted and hence the balance of convenience is in favour of the Petitioner.
29. The Petitioner states that, the Petitioner has not filed any other Application in respect of the subject matter of this Application in this Hon'ble Court or the Honb'le Supreme Court of India.




30. The Petitioner shall rely upon the documents exhibited to this Petition and the documents to be filed along with the Petition.
31. The Petitioner craves leave to amend, alter, add, delete or vary any of the aforesaid grounds with the liberty of this Hon'ble Court as and when found necessary.
32. The Petitioner has paid the necessary Court Fees of Rs. 250/- on this Petition as provided in the Bombay Court Fees Act.

THE PETITIONER, THEREFORE, PRAYS:

In view of the above facts and circumstances, the Petitioner, therefore, most humbly prays before this Hon'ble Court that it be pleased to :



- (a) Issue a Writ of Mandamus or a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other writ / order / direction, directing the Respondent No. 1 herein to Re-schedule JEE Min Exam now Scheduled in the month of January, 2023 to the month of April, 2023 or any other convenient dates after discussing with all the stake holders along with State Boards;
- (b) Issue a Writ of Mandamus or a writ in the nature of mandamus or any other writ / order / direction, directing the Respondent No.1 & 2 herein to relax the minimum eligibility criteria for appearing the JEE Main Exam fixed at 75% for General category candidates and 65% for SC/ST candidates in XII Board Examination.
- (c) the costs of this Petition be provided for;
- (d) For such other and further reliefs as the nature and circumstances of the case may require.

Tech) at NITs, IITs, other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs), Institutions/Universities funded/recognized by participating State Governments. It is also an eligibility test for JEE (Advanced), which is conducted for admission to IITs. **Paper 2** is conducted for admission to **B. Arch and B. Planning** courses in the Country.

For Academic Session 2023-24, it has been decided that the **JEE (Main) – 2023 will be conducted in two Sessions i.e. Session 1 (January 2023) and Session 2 (April 2023).** The details for the **Session 1 (January 2023)** are given below:

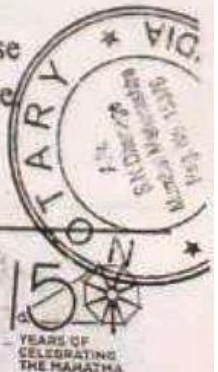

The Annual Practical Examinations/Internal Assessments/Project Assessments for session 2022-23 are scheduled to start w.e.f. 1 January 2023.

All the stake holders are requested to take the following necessary actions to ensure timely completion of Practical Examinations/Internal Assessments/Project Assessments.

ACTION BY SCHOOLS

1. The schools will ensure that the syllabus for Practical Examinations is completed well in time.
2. The schools will ensure that necessary arrangements like preparation and stocking of laboratories and identification of Internal Examiners have been done well in time.
3. The schools will ensure that all the students and parents have been informed about the date-sheet of Practical Examinations for needful action at their end.
4. The list of candidates (LOC) who will be appearing for the practical examinations from the school is to be checked from online system and it is to be ensured that the correct subjects and category of students (i.e., regular/compartments/ improvement) is reflected in the online system.
5. It may be ensured that sufficient number of practical answer books have been received in the schools before the date of actual conduct of practical examinations.
6. In case any shortcoming is observed in respect of any of the above points the concerned Regional Office may be contacted.
7. Practical Examinations for Class-XII will be conducted only by the external examiners appointed by the Board.



ACTION BY STUDENTS

8. The students/Parents must ensure that their subjects of studies are being reflected correctly in the list of candidates submitted by the schools.

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IMPORTANT NOTICE TO CANDIDATES

The Indian School Certificate Year 2023 Examination results will be issued through the Conveners to the Heads of Schools in the month of May 2023. The results will NOT be available from the office of CISCE in New Delhi. Queries about the results by candidates/parents/guardians will not be entertained by CISCE.

Note: Chief/Supervising Examiners are advised to take all necessary steps to ensure that the following directions are brought to the notice of all the candidates under examination.

DIRECTIONS TO CANDIDATES

(TEACHERS are advised to take care that their pupils are carefully drilled to carry out the following directions)

1. Be seated in the Examination Hall / Room five minutes before the time fixed for the start of the examination in the subject.
 2. A candidate who arrives late will be required to give a satisfactory explanation and reason to the Supervising Examiner. Except in exceptional circumstances, a paper will not be given to any candidate who is more than half an hour late. Absolute punctuality is essential. Candidates are not allowed to leave the Examination Hall/Room before the conclusion of the paper.
 3. If an Examination Paper for which you are not entered is handed to you, or if the questions indicate that a map or any other stationery should also have been given to you, bring it to the attention of the Supervising Examiner at once.
 4. Read carefully any general direction that may be given at the head of a paper, e.g. directions regarding number of questions that should be attempted, etc.
 5. You are advised to answer only that number of questions as mentioned in the question paper.
 6. On the top – sheet of the Main Answer Booklet, put your signature in the space provided for the purpose. Do NOT scribble anywhere on the top-sheet.
 7. Clearly write your Unique ID (Unique Identification Number), Index Number and Subject on the top-sheet of the Main Answer Booklet in the space provided. This information should also be written on the front sheet of each continuation booklet used. If you are using loose maps, graph papers, etc. write this information on these also. All entries on the Answer Booklet should be made with Black/Blue ball-point pen ONLY.
 8. Candidates must write on both sides of each sheet of the answer booklet unless the rubric of the question paper prohibits this. While writing in the answer booklet leave a margin at both, right-hand and left-hand edges. Begin the answer to each separate part of a question on a separate line.
 9. Write the number of the question clearly in the left-hand margin, at the beginning of each answer. Do not copy the question. Be careful to use the same system of numbering as that in the question paper. Leave a line after the answer to each question.
 10. Remember that handwriting and spelling will be taken into account. You may use a fountain pen or a ball-point pen for writing your answers. Pencils may be used only for drawing diagrams. Bring mathematical and drawing instruments and colour pencils for subjects for which they will be needed. You are permitted to use Casio fx-82 MS (Scientific Calculator) or calculators of other makes with similar functions or calculators with only basic functions. Use of any calculator with features for retrieval of information during examination is not permitted.
 11. In addition to the time indicated in the timetable for writing the paper, 15 minutes time is given for reading the questions.
 12. Read the questions very carefully. Time should not be wasted in writing information that is not asked for as no marks will be given for it.
- Do not spend too much time on one or two questions so as to leave yourself no time to answer the others.
- When the time allotted for writing the examination has concluded, arrange your answer scripts in SEQUENTIAL ORDER, THE FIRST PAGE AT THE TOP, etc. See that the main answer booklet / continuation sheets / graphs / map have your Unique ID (Unique Identification Number), Index Number and Subject written on them. Fasten them together at the left-hand top corner and hand them over unfolded.

CAUTION

USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

1. If the Awarding Committee is satisfied that a candidate has made arrangements to obtain unfair help in connection with the question papers from any person connected with the examination centre or any agency within or outside the examination centre, the candidate is liable to have his/her results in the examination as a whole cancelled.
2. (i) Candidates who are detected in giving or obtaining, or attempting to give or obtain, unfair assistance, or who are otherwise detected in any dishonesty whatsoever, relating to the Examination, will be reported to the **Chief Executive and Secretary of CISCE** and may be expelled from the examination hall/room forthwith and refused admission to subsequent examination papers.
(ii) The Supervising Examiner or any member of the supervisory staff shall confiscate the answer scripts in which the use of unfair assistance is detected / suspected.
(iii) The Supervising Examiner shall send the confiscated answer scripts with a report giving the details of the evidence and the explanation of the candidate/s concerned to the **Chief Executive and Secretary of CISCE** without delay and, if possible, on the day of the occurrence.
(iv) In case the candidate/s concerned refuse to give explanatory statements they should not be forced to do so, only the fact of refusal shall be recorded by the Supervising Examiner and attested by one / two members of the supervisory staff on duty at the time of the occurrence.
(v) The Supervising Examiner has the discretion to permit such candidates to answer the remaining part of the question paper but on answer sheets that are separate from those in which the use of unfair means was detected / suspected.
3. Candidates found guilty of:
(i) bringing in answer sheets; or
(ii) taking out or attempting to take out answer sheets; or
(iii) substituting answer scripts or getting answer scripts replaced during or after the examination with or without the help of any person connected with the examination centre, or any agency within or outside the examination centre, shall be reported to the **Chief Executive and Secretary of CISCE** and their results in the examination as a whole will be cancelled.
4. If it is subsequently discovered and the **Awarding Committee** is satisfied that candidate/s has/have either copied from other candidate/s or given opportunity to other candidate/s to copy from them or communicated dishonestly with other candidate/s, their results in the paper or subject or subjects in question or their results in the examination as a whole will be cancelled.
5. Candidates detected in approaching directly or indirectly an examiner or any member of the staff of CISCE with the object of influencing them regarding any candidate's examination result shall have their result in the examination as a whole cancelled.
6. Candidates found guilty of disorderly conduct or causing disturbance in or near the examination hall/room are liable to be expelled from the examination hall/room forthwith and will henceforth be refused admission for subsequent examination papers.
7. (i) Candidates are not permitted to have in their possession, while in the examination hall/room, any book, memorandum or pocketbook, notes, paper, mobile phones or wireless devices, except the correct question paper. They must also return any incorrect question paper to the Supervising Examiner immediately.
(ii) Candidates are not permitted to have in their possession any weapon or an object or instrument which may be used as a weapon during the course of the Examination.
(iii) Candidates disregarding the above cautions are liable to have their results in the examination as a whole cancelled.

- Persons obtaining admission to the examination on false representation shall be expelled from the hall/room forthwith and will be reported to the Police.
- (i) Candidates who are involved in the acts of impersonation shall be reported to the Chief Executive Secretary of CISCE and their results in the examination as a whole will be cancelled.
 - (ii) The decision in respect of the results of candidates who are detected/suspected of using unfair means may be delayed considerably and their results may not be issued with the results of other candidates.
 - (ii) Candidates whose results in the examination as a whole have been cancelled may be debarred from entry to any subsequent examination.
10. A person who commits an offence under these Regulations, but is not a candidate, shall be dealt with as under:
- (i) The Chief Executive and Secretary of CISCE may, if he so decides, handover the case to the Police.
 - (ii) In the case of a teacher or a person connected with an institution, his / her misconduct shall be reported to the Governing (or Managing) Body of the institution for necessary action.
11. Entries for subsequent examinations may not be accepted from a school where any member of the staff has at any time committed any offence under these Regulations.
12. If the Awarding Committee is satisfied that the use of dishonest means in a paper or papers has been widespread at a centre, the Awarding Committee reserves the right to cancel the results of all candidates of that centre in the paper or papers concerned, or of the entire examination as a whole at the centre, if several papers are involved.
13. For cases of use of unfair means not covered by these Regulations, the Awarding Committee may impose penalties according to the nature of the offence.

LAST DATE FOR RETAINING ANSWER SCRIPTS

CISCE does not undertake to retain answer scripts of the candidates later than 60 days from the day of the declaration of results. The same shall be destroyed thereafter.

For enquiries concerning examination results, attention is invited to Section H under CHAPTER II on page 6 of the INDIAN SCHOOL CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION YEAR 2023 REGULATIONS & SYLLABUSES.

Note: Applications for recheck of answer scripts must be submitted online and must be received by CISCE's office not later than SEVEN days from the day of declaration of the ISC Year 2023 Examination results.

1. Candidates who are entered as regular candidates for the ISC Year 2023 Examination and who fail to secure Pass Certificates will be permitted to reappear for the ISC Examination in the Year 2024, but not thereafter, without further attendance, at an affiliated and registered school.
2. Candidates who are awarded Pass Certificates at the ISC Examination, may appear for a Supplementary Pass Certificate in one or more subjects in the ISC Year 2024 Examination. Such candidates must choose only those subjects, which they had offered in the previous ISC Examination.
3. Entries of candidates wishing to re-appear for the ISC Examination in the Year 2024 can be submitted ONLINE during the months of August and September 2023 through the Heads of Schools concerned.
4. Candidates who fail to secure Pass Certificates (**Pass Certificate Not Awarded**) will be permitted to appear for the **Compartment Examination** in any ONE subject in which they have not secured the Pass Mark. However, the candidates should have secured the Pass Mark in English (Compulsory) and two other subjects in the ISC Year 2023 Examination to be eligible to appear for the Compartment Examination. The entries of all such candidates will be submitted online to CISCE by the Head of the school concerned.

Note : It is advised that all precautions against Covid – 19 may be taken during the conduct of the ISC 2023 Examination at the Examination centres.

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Respected DG, NTA and Other Concerned Authorities I am a JEE aspirant and I would like to bring following facts for Kind attn of NTA and Other authorities for reviewing the dates for FIRST SESSION OF JEE Mains 2023:-

Considering the following points:

- 1) 1) Dates of JEE Main 2023 were announced just one month before the first session. I remember, in 2020, when the first session was held in Jan 2020, dates were finalized and announced by the NTA in Aug 2019 i.e. 4 months prior to the exam. Notice period of just 1 month is insufficient, unfair, unjust and not rational for the 2023 aspirants.
- 2) 2) The session-1 of JEE Mains 2023 exam is going to be conducted from 24 Jan 2023 to 31 Jan 2023. And, some state boards like Bihar Board (BSEB) have their 12th board exams starting from 1 Feb 2023. Imagine a student of Bihar Board who has his JEE Main on 31 Jan and 12th board exam paper the next day.

Subject - Issues being faced by JEE 2023 aspirants and to reschedule JEE MAINS Exam scheduled in January 2023 and remove 75% eligibility criteria

Respected sir,

I would like to inform you that several JEE aspirants have approached me regarding the issues they are facing pertaining to upcoming JEE MAINS Exam scheduled in January 2023 notified just few days before the exam by NTA due to which lot of students are in trouble.

Major issue is the dates are clashing with board practicals, pre board and also the 75% eligibility criteria is reintroduce which was notified on 15th December 2022 just few days before the exam

These are the issues they are facing

1) Dates of JEE Main 2023 were announced just one month before the firsts session. In 2020, when the first session was held in Jan 2020, dates were finalized and announced by the NTA in Aug 2019 i.e. 4 months prior to the exam. Notice period of just 1 month is insufficient, unfair, unjust and not rational for the 2023 aspirants.

2) The session-1 of JEE Mains 2023 exam is going to be conducted from 24 Jan 2023 to 31 Jan 2023. And, some state boards like Bihar Board (BSEB) have their 12th board exams starting from 1 Feb 2023. Imagine a student of Bihar Board who has his JEE Main on 31 Jan and 12th board exam paper the next day.

3) The addition of 75% criteria is ruining future of many aspirants who took drop this year or previous year as many of them was not able to cross the mark of 75% as their studies were hampered due to COVID-19 and many got victims of unwanted marks given by their respective campus.

Last year they were eligible for nits, iits, iiits irrespective of the board percentage but this Year the same student were not eligible with same percentage. Many students left nit last year and took drop now their whole year and career is ruined.


